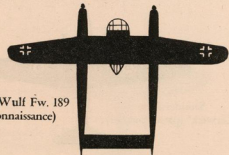

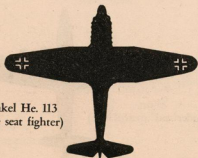

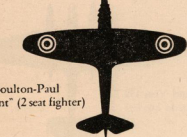
Red, white and blue bull's eye.
